glorious Grey Street is closed for two full days to allow the public to get up close and personal with vehicles varying from Lamborghinis to Ferraris, American Muscle cars to vintage and classic cars and everything in between from 10am until 4pm on both days.

Bus diversions

From 6pm on the evening of Friday 8 July until late on Sunday 10 July, our Quaylink services will be on diversion.

Grey Street will be closed between Mosley Street and Market Street, plus the section of pedestrianised Grey Street north of Market Street towards Monument.

Q1 | Q2 | Q3

- Service Q1 towards Central Station will operate from Dean Street via Mosley Street, Swan House roundabout, Pilgrim Street and Market Street, omitting the northbound bus stop at the southern end of Grey Street, but will serve the normal bus stop on Market Street West.
- Services Q2 & Q3 towards Quayside between Market Street West and Dean Street will operate via Market Street, Pilgrim Street, Swan House roundabout and Mosley Street, omitting the bus stop at the southern end of Grey Street, but serving the old Bank of England stop on Pilgrim Street.
- Service Q3 towards Haymarket will operate from Dean Street via Mosley Street, Swan House roundabout and Pilgrim Street to Market Street East, omitting the northbound stop at the southern end of Grey Street, then left serving the Q1 stop towards Central Station, then Grainger Street, right to Newgate Street, then Percy Street to Haymarket, serving all stop on diversion.
